**Dorothy:**

- One suggestion I have would be to see if you can make the bottom of the ad look less blocky. Maybe create some texture or something!

**Debbie:**

- I like the pictures of the house and that you included the airbnb logo so people know where they can find you, but if you didn't know what that logo was you wouldn't know where to find it
- The text is a bit hard to follow and with the shading does blend in in some areas. Maybe try to uniform the text and change up the background to make it more interesting and easy to know what it says.
- Map could be a bit smaller, you want the eye to be focused on the house and that it is for rent rather than the map.
- Maybe try to find a transparent UT logo so it doesn't feel so blocky and pixelated.

I love the vibrant colors of your flyer! I don't think there could be a more contrasting set of colors than black, white, red, and yellow. I love that you reference a family recipe for ramen – I always love the family recipes! I only have one critique for this flyer: the inset yellow starburst is set behind the white square and lettering straddles the two shapes. I would recommend bringing the starburst to the front and including only the most important text. The white box can then contain necessary information that is not as important to highlight. Great job!
